To apply for a £2000 grant to get your group's plans off the ground, please complete and submit our <u>online application form by 10am on Friday 24th March.</u>

The online application form is also available in Welsh.

Before getting started...

Have a read of all the questions. We've listed them in this document to make it easy for you to get prepared. When completing the online form, you'll be asked to:

- 1. Upload a copy of a letter/email giving landowner permission for the space you wish to transform, if relevant to your project.
- 2. Upload a copy of your group's safeguarding children and vulnerable adults policy and procedures.
- 3. Share a link to your group's five minute 'elevator pitch' video.
- 4. You may also upload up to three photographs, to show us the space you hope to transform.

The online application form should be completed by the person who will be leading the project for your group, they must be aged 18 or over.

Please make sure you have read our online guidance for applicants and checked your group is eligible for a grant.

Your project idea

14. This is the part where we ask you to submit your 'elevator pitch' telling us about your ideas.

In your pitch, don't forget to tell us...

- About your group
- About your idea and why you want to do it
- · Where will you transform show us the space if you can
- How your idea will celebrate UK native plants
- How your project will help enhance local biodiversity
 Who you will involve and how they will benefit.
- How you will spend the £2000

Please paste a link to your video into the application form.

Please ensure that you have consent from all participants in the video and they have been informed that it will be shared with Grow Wild. If your video includes any young people under 18, you must obtain their parental consent.

Please make sure your link is enabled for Grow Wild to view. Videos should be a maximum of 5 minutes long.

15. You may also upload up to three photographs to show us the space you would like to transform.

This is optional, so if you feel you're able to show us your space clearly enough through your video submission, you can skip this. But we're keen to know as much about your project location as possible.

Three photographs can be uploaded.

- 16. Please tell us how your project idea will have a positive impact for local people in your project area. (Up to 300 words)
- 17. Please explain how your project idea will help to improve local biodiversity.

For example, this could include mention of the current condition of your project space, the sorts of plants you would like to grow, the ways in which local wildlife might be benefitted etc. (Up to 300 words).

Grow Wild is keen to fund groups that care about the planet and will choose sustainable materials and practices when completing their project. As part of this, we will ask all successful groups to commit to buying only peat-free compost.

- 18. Please tell us about any other steps your group will be taking to be environmentally friendly and any sustainable choices you will be making. For example using recycled materials, buying local, composting, installing a water butt, not using pesticides etc. (Up to 300 words)
- 19. If successful, your Grow Wild funded project will need to be completed during the summer months, with the full grant spent by the end of October 2023. Please tell us if there is anything that may impact the timing of your project.

If you are a secondary school, please explain how your project will operate during the school holidays.
